

Introduction

Our firm, Omega Financial Group, LLC, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services to retail investors. Our advisory services include Asset Management, Wrap Comprehensive Portfolio Management, and Financial Planning & Consulting. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we'll meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, goals, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we'll recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least annually, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs, stated goals and objectives. We'll offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio. Financial Planning & Consulting is included in our Asset Management and Wrap Comprehensive Portfolio Management services for no additional fee.

Financial Planning & Consulting is also offered as a separate service. We do not monitor your investments for the Financial Planning & Consulting service.

We manage accounts on a discretionary basis. After you sign an agreement with our firm, we're allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm.

We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments. Our firm now requires a minimum account balance of \$1,000,000 for our Asset Management service.

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing monthly fee based on the value of the investments in your account. We charge an advisory fee of 1.00% of assets under management or a \$10,000 per year minimum flat fee, whichever is greater, for our Asset Management service. Accounts over \$2,000,000 may be subject to a lower fee based on the complexity of the services offered. We charge an advisory fee of 1.50% of assets under management or a \$10,000 per year minimum flat fee, whichever is greater, for our wrap service.

The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our fees. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm's fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, our firm will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm's fees from your advisory account.

Our flat fee ranges from \$1,500 to \$20,000 and hourly rate ranges from \$200 to \$950 for our Financial Planning & Consulting service. We charge an upfront retainer when you sign an agreement for this service.

The custodian that holds your assets charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. Their fees are in addition to our firm's fees for our Asset Management service. We pay the custodian's transaction fees charged to you for our wrap service. The fees for our wrap fee program are therefore higher than a typical asset-based advisory fee.

You may also pay charges imposed by the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

One of our firm’s financial professionals is a licensed insurance agent who may sell insurance products for a commission. He has an incentive to recommend insurance products to you in order to increase his compensation. However, we will always notify you of any insurance recommendation that will generate a commission for our firm.

For our wrap service, we have an incentive to recommend assets without transaction fees in order to reduce the amount of fees that we will have to pay on your behalf.

Three of our financial professionals have an incentive to advise you to invest in the Argos Total Return Fund, LP because they manage the fund through Argos Global Advisors, LLC.
